The project “ RORS00240 – Banat Honey Route” focuses on tourism development and involves three regions: South Banat district in Serbia, and Timiș and Caraș-Severin counties in Romania. The Banat region, divided only by a border, has strong potential for beekeeping and apitherapy but lacks a structured tourism offer, especially in eco- and health tourism, and suffers from limited digital promotion. The project aims to create a new cross-border tourist product – the Banat Honey Route – showcasing the health benefits of bee products while strengthening cooperation between South Banat (Serbia), Timiș and Caraș-Severin (Romania).

The project aims to develop the Banat Honey Route as an innovative cross-border eco- and health-tourism product in South Banat (Serbia), Timiș and Caraș-Severin (Romania). The initiative will equip beekeepers with multifunctional trailers for apitherapy, support laboratory

testing of bee products, and promote their health benefits through a dedicated digital platform and targeted promotional activities.

To achieve this objective, four partner organizations will cooperate to:

- Provide beekeepers with modern tools and apitherapy equipment.
- Deliver training workshops to increase beekeepers' knowledge on apitherapy and the healing properties of bee products.
- Establish laboratory capacity for testing and certification of honey and related products to ensure quality and safety.
- Develop an online platform and digital tour (including drone footage) to present the Banat Honey Route to a wider audience.
- Organize a promotional tour with tourism stakeholders, NGOs, travel agencies, and media representatives to showcase the new route.

This cross-border collaboration will strengthen tourism promotion, raise the visibility of local beekeepers, and create a sustainable tourist offer that improves the health and well-being of visitors through apitherapy.

The Banat Honey Route is a novel concept not yet implemented in the programme area, providing added value and long-term benefits for the region.
